### **Talking Points:**

<u>Loyalty is Fundamental</u>: Loyalty is an essential element to having right relationships with others. The ability for others to trust you to do your part and follow through allows them to focus on their own duties and responsibilities, allowing everyone to benefit as a result.

<u>Loyalty requires Commitment</u>: Loyalty is sometimes tough, especially when things are difficult. But keeping true to our word, our responsibilities and duties, and the causes that are important to us is part of being true to ourselves, and not making the lives we live a lie before others.

<u>Loyalty requires Integrity</u>: To make a commitment and fail to honor it is an untruth. Truthfulness and loyalty go hand-in-hand and the level of loyalty we display is a measure of our character.

<u>Loyalty promotes Success</u>: People who are loyal bring out the best in themselves and others, and everyone achieves more as a result. Loyalty breeds mutual success.
