### Why is Responsibility Important?

*"Your responsibility is to obey the terms of the covenant."*

1. Responsible people take personal responsibility for their choices.
2. Responsible people keep their word and honor their commitments
3. Responsible people are examples of dependability
4. Responsible people encourage others to also be responsible.
5. Responsible people perform their tasks with excellence.

### Talking Points:

Know and Do What is Required: Fulfill your duties and obligations, whatever your role in life (child, parent, employee, employer, friend, citizen, etc...)

Be Accountable: Take personal ownership of your work and do it well. Don't leave your work for others to do. Seek those who will push you toward excellence.

Don't Make Excuses: Don't "pass the buck" or blame others for your mistakes, even if they helped contribute to the problem. If you made a mistake, admit it, learn from it, and don't repeat that mistake in the future.

Strive for Excellence: Do everything to please your Heavenly Father, and do it right the first time. Good enough is not enough...strive for excellence in all you do.
